## **Custodial Care**

## **Benefit**

Custodial care services are not in benefit.

## Interpretation

Custodial Care Service means any service primarily for personal comfort or convenience that provides general maintenance, preventive, and/or protective care without clinical likelihood of improvement of the condition. Custodial Care Services also means those services which do not require the technical skills or professional training and clinical assessment ability of medical and/or nursing personnel in order to be safely and effectively performed. These services can be safely provided by trained or capable non-professional personnel, are to assist with routine medical needs (e.g. simple care and dressings, administration of medications etc.) and are to assist with activities of daily living (e.g. bathing, eating, dressing, etc.). Custodial Care Service also means providing care on a continuous Inpatient or Outpatient basis without any clinical improvement by the member.

The nature of a service, rather than the licensure or certification of the person(s) providing the service, determines whether the service is skilled or custodial.

If a court mandates the member's site of care and the member is receiving custodial services only, such services are not in benefit.
