

II. PROCEDURE

- 1. The starting point, to establish if the emergency services were rendered out- of -area, is the location in which the member primarily receives their medical care, which is the Primary Care Physician's office.
- 2. If there is more than a 30-mile radius between the IPA Physician and the IPA Affiliated Hospital(s), the IPA must use the locations of the PCP and all IPA Affiliated Hospitals to determine the 30-mile radius. In order to meet the Out of Area (OOA) criteria, the measurement from each location must be more than 30 miles from the place of service.
- 3. The IPA must use the "measure distance" feature on the Google Maps website to verify if the emergency services are out of area.
 - On your computer, open Google Maps.
 - Get directions from your starting point and ending point
 - Right-click on your starting point.
 - Choose Measure distance.
 - Right-click on your ending point

- Choose Distance to here
- At the bottom, you'll see the total distance in miles (mi) and kilometers (km).



- If the member receives emergency services, the IPA must use the approved website to verify if the emergency services were rendered more than a 30-mile radius of the IPA Physician or IPA Affiliated Hospital.
- If the IPA verifies the emergency services were rendered more than a 30-mile radius of the IPA Physician or IPA Affiliated Hospital, the IPA will stamp the claim with the appropriate approval status of Not Group Approved Out of Area (NGA-OOA) and forward the claim(s) to BCBSIL for processing.
